
Trinity United Methodist School

First Fruits and First Checks

"Travel with me in your mind to a setting that occurred thousands of years ago in the desert. We see multitudes of people full of joy approaching the tabernacle of God. They are coming with their sacrifices and tithes to give thanks to God for all that He has done. As we approach the tabernacle we see the beautiful blue, purple, and scarlet drapes hanging to the ground. After entering the tabernacle we see a huge bronze altar, forever burning. After walking a short distance, our nostrils are filled with the smell of incense. We see the curtains surrounding the Holy Place, and we know behind those curtains lie the Most Holy Place—the place where God lives, on top of the Ark between the cherubs. We are there to offer sacrifices and give a tenth to the Lord, our first fruits.

"Today, we don't offer animal sacrifices to God. However, we can still celebrate all that God has done for us by bringing our tithes before the Lord. We know the Lord does not live on top of a box behind a curtain. Our God is here in this place, among us now, ready to accept our gifts!

"About eight or nine years ago, my wife Georgia and I joined LakeRidge. At that time we had several college loans, a car payment, a young daughter, etc. etc. Boy, were we giving and giving. The typical beginning of the month was to pay all the bills. Then to give to the church what was left over. Which I can assure you was not very much.

"A short time later, we were challenged to participate in the 'Forward in Faith' campaign. Our first response was 'We can't give more to the church, we barely make it now.' However, we sought God and trusted Him and we took what felt like a gigantic leap of faith.

"Realizing that we were doing things backwards, the next month I did things in reverse. I wrote the first check to our church. I paid the bills with what was left. At the end of the month, we had made had made it!

"The Bible makes the purpose of tithing very clear—to put God first in our lives. We are to give God the first and the best part of what we earn. What we do first with our money shows what we value most. Giving the first part of our earnings to God immediately focuses our attention on Him. It also reminds us that all we have belongs to Him. A habit of regular tithing keeps God at the top of our priority list and gives us proper perspective on everything else we have.

hat if others treated you the way you treat them?

Yes, this is a backwards way of looking at the Golden Rule. Somehow it speaks to me more from this angle. I feel like not doing anything “bad” is being passive. Doing something “good” is being active. There are sins of commission and sins of omission. If you didn’t call someone when he missed church or lost someone to death or was in the hospital, you have committed a sin of omission. If you caused a death or purposely put someone in the hospital, you have committed a sin of commission.

When you tell someone he is not good enough to sing in the choir or pretty enough to be a model or smart enough to work in an office, you may feel that you are simply telling the truth and believing that that shouldn’t hurt a person’s feelings. Just stand in the mirror and say that same thing to yourself. Would it have hurt you to hear it from someone else?

Do you say things or do things that you know will hurt? Have you asked yourself, “Why?” Was it really meant to be constructive criticism, or were you trying to build yourself up by tearing someone else down? I am convinced that when people tear others down with either words or deeds, those people are insecure. As a teacher or trainer, it could be your job to tell people what they have done wrong or where the need to improve; but unless you really are an expert on whatever you are criticizing, you have no right to say anything. Really! Do you secretly hope that your “target” will go home and cry after hearing you? So, are you really a Christian?

We all have talents. Some of us have many talents; some have only a few, or only one. Look at the result of your work to see whether what you did was a talent or just a desire for one. As a child I wanted to be a Rockette! Then, I found out I had to be between 5’ 6” and 5’ 8” and I had to be coordinated. Neither of those things is true. However, give me a stack of what would appear to be way too much to fit into a suitcase or closet, and I WILL get it in there!

Please listen to the words coming (or about to come) out of your mouth and try to hear them coming back to you. Would you have been hurt? I understand you could have been trying to help, but you really need to MAKE SURE the recipient knows that is your goal. If your only intent was to hurt, then, you are not being a Christian, and you have accomplished nothing positive.

All sins are not murders or thefts or abuses. Some are only small ones that might even hurt more than these “big” ones. And, yes, I know things sometimes just leap out of my mouth before I have time to consider them. I really try to control my mouth, but it isn’t always easy. All I can ask of myself or anyone is to give it the best effort.
