Servant Evangelism

D ear Friends,

The word evangelism conjures up a host of images in the minds of Christians, most of them negative or intimidating. Most of us consider ourselves ill equipped for the task of leading another person to Christ. We are fairly certain that there is more involved than sharing the Roman Road and leading someone in praying the sinner's prayer. Yet, whatever that something more is remains for us somewhat mysterious.

Servant evangelism offers a low-risk, natural way of connecting with people without religious tracts, gimmicks, or an advanced degree in theology. Who doesn't like to be given a cold soda on a hot day especially by someone who is smiling, happy and having fun? Servant evangelism wins the heart before it confronts the mind. A small act of kindness nudges a person closer to God, often in a profound way as it bypasses one's mental defenses. The average Christ-follower is willing to hand a stranger a can of soda (low-risk). The high grace is seen in the typical reaction. "Oh, thank you!" "This is so nice!" "I can't believe this is for free!" And, "Why are you doing this?"

Kindness builds the bridge for the person to receive a touch of love from God. Add an invitation to church or other method of connection—even a simple card with our church's name, phone number and times of services—and you've reached someone with the love of Christ! It's simple, practical, effective, inexpensive and fun! Pastors, lay leaders and ordinary Christ-followers all over the world are discovering the power and impact of "showing God's love in practical ways," and again and again we've seen relationships with God born from these simple acts of kindness in Christ's name.

should be able to readily see that we enjoy church. As we sing, we should "make a joyful noise unto the Lord." We should have "joy like a fountain" from hearing the Word – the knowledge that through Christ we are saved!

If you don't feel better after coming to church, something's missing. Either your church is not offering what you need, or you are not "receiving" what it's offering. Do you come in with an open mind, or have you already decided what the message is before you even hear it? Do you, at least, come to join in fellowship with others, or would you be better served to watch a service on TV?

I am on several committees, and during most of those meetings, we laugh while we are getting God's work done. Someone usually led us in prayer for these meetings, and he often thanked God for laughter. That same "thank-you" was usually said during our lunch period on Thursdays. Many of us truly enjoy fellowship at Trinity! If you were a visitor and came into a church where you saw frowns or just no expression at all on people's faces, would you want to return to that church? A previous member of our church used to say, "If sitting in a church makes you a Christian, then sitting in a garage should make you a Buick." Churches where there's "a sweet, sweet spirit in this place" tend to grow. Churches where people don't talk to each other, where they just sit in the pew, tend to have fewer and fewer people and eventually close their doors. I am happy to notice that the pastor usually has to tell us to stop talking before he/she can begin the service. That's a really good sign.

I hope you enjoy being at church, at Sunday school, and even at meetings! When you come to this church, please, have fun!
