ear Friends, As we move into the last quarter of the year, I pause to reflect on the wonderful new thing God is doing in and through Trinity United Methodist Church. I hope each of you will do the same. I would particularly like to invite you to reflect on your role in the life and ministry of Trinity. How are you growing and serving Jesus in and

To all who choose to believe in him, Jesus offers a simple invitation, "Follow me." To all who accept this invitation, Jesus promises an amazing adventure, a journey along the way of salvation that will transform the disciple in heart mind and soul. new thing is God doing in and through the ministry of Trinity United Methodist Church? Come and see. There is an important distinction between confessing faith in Jesus Christ and following him. To confess faith in Jesus Christ requires only intellectual assent. To follow in his footsteps, to become a disciple requires movement; following

Firstly, he or she must be involved in some type of personal spiritual formation. In Wesleyan terms, that means regularly engaging in acts of personal piety. These being reading, meditating and studying the scriptures, prayer, fasting, regularly attending worship, healthy living, and sharing our faith with others. Additionally, one must regularly share in the sacraments, Christian conversation, and Bible study.

The second way is through works of mercy, such as, doing good works, visiting the sick, visiting those in prison, feeding the hungry, and giving generously to the needs of others, seeking justice, ending oppression and discrimination, and addressing the needs of the poor.

Again, I invite each of us to take some time to reflect on the ways in which we are living into the invitation to become disciples of Jesus Christ. At the same time, ask how we as a church are helping others to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ? What are we doing well? What could we do better? On December 4, we will gather after worship to share a common meal (potluck). After we eat we will meet to celebrate what God has already done in and through Trinity and to look forward to what may come in 2017. We will also use this time to complete the annual business of the local church, by electing new officers, approving reports, and setting the pastor's compensation for the coming year. Please plan to attend this very important event!


An Epitaph

If you do that, nice things will be said of you, and you will see God in heaven. I know I won't be able to do this all the time, but it is my goal to live each day hoping only positive things will be said about me.
