The COVID-19 virus has certainly changed things! One of the things that has changed is the way we meet together. Many of you have had ZOOM meetings with friends, family and co-workers. I hope you are aware that we have been broadcasting our worship services on-line each week. I want to explain some other digital components of our communication.

Text-in-Church: This program allows us to send out either text or email messages to individuals, groups, or even the entire congregation. Hopefully, you have received these messages. Please be sure we have your email and cell phone number.

Evening Vespers: At 5:00pm each afternoon, you are invited to join an on-line vesper service. A ZOOM meeting link is emailed and posted on the church Facebook page each Monday, and that same link is valid for Monday -Friday. For Saturday, there is a prerecorded service and a Youtube link is posted on Facebook and Youtube.

On-line Sunday Worship: You can access the service by going to our church website - tumcsa.net. We are broadcasting our worship service through two formats - Youtube and Facebook. You can also go to our Facebook page - Trinity United Methodist Church San Antonio. You do not have to have a Facebook account to do this. The service will not be there prior to worship, as it is recorded live. However, it is available anytime after

10:00am on Sunday. It is archived and can be viewed after worship is concluded also.

ear Friends,

Felicite and I met in the spring of 2002. A charming young lady, a daughter so fair blight and debonair, a paragon of virtue, displaying an air of confidence, intelligence, passionate about God and manifesting deep spirituality. This was the façade we shared,



but it will take us commitments, efforts, devotion and spending time together for years before we could actually know and understand who we are, the virtues and strength we both bring to the table and the abilities to accept our weaknesses and process them graciously together. This is how we grew in relationship and in understanding and accepting God's gift to us. I know we all have some commonalities in building relationships and growing and learning about others as we live together. It is in this same light that we grow in the love and knowledge of God.

John, in the gospel, described himself as the one whom Jesus loves. He gave us an in-depth exegesis on what it means to grow in grace and in the knowledge of God. The Apostle writes in 1st John 1:1-4 "That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life— 2 the life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us— 3 that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. 4 And we are writing these things so that our[a] joy may be complete".

John is assuring us that his experience with Jesus is based on reality, what he saw, heard with his own ears, and even touched. He gives two reasons why he is passing on this good news. He says that it is "so that you may have fellowship with us; and our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ." So John is calling us to be relational. The sharing of this truth brings about fellowship, participation with one another and with the triune God Himself. This truth leads to a change in our relationships as we begin to live and grow together, it leads to new fellowship in Christ and nurtures us to a joy that is complete - having others joining us in enjoying the pie.

John says "This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him is no darkness at all." This is the best news John has for us. This is the first thing we have to tell our friends and love ones. Do you know someone in whom there is no darkness? I don't. But what I know is that we are all looking to know and have someone we can totally and completely trust.

We long to find that someone who we can be vulnerable with and trust that they will know how to handle our vulnerability. When I met my wife, I quickly realized that the darkness that kept me from being completely vulnerable to her was my own very sinful condition. This means I was still somewhat in darkness. As humans, we don't fully know the truth about ourselves and others. Darkness comes partly from the ignorance that comes with our brokenness. We cannot totally reveal ourselves because we don't fully know ourselves and because some of what we are is still not only toxic, but septic to others and to ourselves.

The Apostle wants us to know that we can completely count on God. There is no lying in God, no "dark side and no brokenness." God is all one thing, "light". I need not be afraid to put my trust in God. I need not be afraid to reveal myself to God because God knows me better

than I know myself, and God will not betray my confidence. If the circumstances in my life look dark at times, I am reminded that I need not be afraid because God remains the same, all that God is, is light and life giving.

As we begin our faith journey with our brothers and sisters here at Trinity, God is calling us to grow in grace and in Knowledge by communing (koinonia) with one another in the Holy Communion when God makes the elements be for us the body and the blood of Christ, so we become one with each other, one with God and one in ministry and missions to the world.

This oneness with God is what unites us in our brokenness and weaknesses. It is the core of our ontology and the essence of our DNA. It is He who was made flesh and dwell among us, it is the content of His teachings, His atoning work at the cross, and the Victorious power of His resurrection.

As we grow in knowing our selves, lets come as we are, accept one another for who God created us to be, and look up to Jesus so His light can light up the darkness in our hearts. When this happens, we will learn new ways of being that will increase that Divine energy in us, manifested as truth in our doctrine, in virtues, in holiness and in our spirituality. Together we shall unleash the strongest weapons against darkness which is our love for God, for one another, and for our community.
