Hello brothers and sisters in Christ,

I want to thank everyone who has given to TUMC, either by their regular offering or going above and beyond the normal giving to specific needs like window replacement, major plumbing issues, and paying 2024 apportionments.

We raised money in the latter part of last year for apportionments and other expenses. After raising the funds, a private donor paid the 2024 apportionments on behalf of TUMC. We put the money we collected in savings to help pay for 2025 expenses. Several of our members paid their 2025 pledges in December and January.

After attending the Church Council meeting on March 9, 2025, I want to explain some things that have happened at TUMC in the last several months.

I have had several people ask me if we have enough money to keep the doors open through February, March, etc. Because we have so many great givers in our congregation, we have stayed open to do God's work. Unless we have some large, unexpected expenses, the money we collected in 2024 will help us stay open through at least June of this year.

The three largest expenses we have at TUMC are property insurance, apportionments, and the pastor's salary. We cannot drop our insurance due to legal reasons. We have struggled in the past paying all of our apportionments and we are under contract with the conference for a full-time pastor through June 2025. We voted at our March meeting to request the conference to assign a retired pastor to our church in July to help cut one of the largest expenses we have.

We have signed a lease with a daycare center, A2Z, to rent a majority of the school building and they should start moving in and start their program very soon. It will take a year for the center to pay full rent, but we will have the opportunity very soon to expose the children attending the daycare to how awesome God's love is. We are hoping to build a strong bridge with the daycare and let them know their children and families are welcome to make TUMC their church home.

We have given a landscape business the opportunity to upgrade our garden in the front. They are using all but 4 lots in the garden to plant several different types of plants for them to have a place their clients can visit to see what type of services they provide. The only cost to us is providing water for the garden. If you are interested in growing something in one of these four empty lots, please contact the church office. The benefit to us will be the traffic of their clients coming to our property to see their landscape, and they will hopefully be curious about attending our church.

I am proud to be a member of TUMC because when times get tough, so many of our members are right there ready to help with whatever we need. I pray we all stay close to each other and continue to work together for the greater good of our God.

Jesus' resurrection means that death is not the end. That while my body may lie rotting


in the ground, Jesus, whom the Father raised from the dead, gives me eternal life. Ultimately, we Christians believe, our bodies, too, will be raised from the dead.








Somehow having another birthday has led
