don't know about you, but I've heard a lot of droopy prayers in my lifetime. And I've prayed a lot of them, too. Here listed below are just a few of them.

Prayers of desperation -- God, you've got to help me! Prayers of self-pity -- God, things are so awful! Prayers of resignation -- God, if you want to leave me unemployed, then I can't stop you!

But I'm learning how to pray a different kind of prayer -- prayers said with thanksgiving. I learned it from the apostle Paul who, writing from prison, taught me a most powerful lesson. He said,

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition,

with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." (Philippians 4:6)

Strange. Here the apostle Paul is suffering himself, yet he's telling me (and you) to pray with thanksgiving.

Thanksgiving is the seasoning that makes our prayers more acceptable to God. After all, who wants to hear people whine all the time? I've learned that you can't whine and give thanks in the same breath. Self-pity and thankfulness don't mix any better than oil and water.

In fact, mixing thanks with whining prayer somehow changes it. When we remember what God has done for us in the past and think about who he is in the present -- and express that in thankfulness -- our prayers become gentler, more trusting somehow. Thankful prayers are offered with faith. And faith is an essential ingredient for prayers that I believe God chooses to answer more often.

Remember the Pilgrims on Thanksgiving Day, not so much for their turkey dinner, but for the sheer faith that inspired them to give thanks in a year that saw nearly half their number die of sickness. Yet they prayed with thanksgiving.

When your annual day of feasting is over, you may be so full that you passed on your extra helpings of dressing, mashed potatoes, and pumpkin pie. But if you can hang on to the "thanks" part of Thanksgiving,



you will be a different person; because when you learn to talk to God about your needs - mixed with a healthy dose of heartfelt thanks -- then you have crossed the divide from whining at God to <u>real prayer</u> of <u>Thanks</u> <u>Giving</u>.

I hope everyone is enjoying the tiny bit of Fall weather we are having! This is one of my favorite times of year. November is time to give extra thanks to God for all my blessings, and December is the month we celebrate the greatest gift ever given, God's son!

I know some churchgoers are not always excited about going to church during October and November because a lot of churches have their Stewardship Campaign during this time. I used to feel that way. I would like to share with you how I changed my thinking on this subject and in doing so turned my life around for the better and have never looked back.

Some of you already know my story but some don't. I grew up as a Methodist, and I saw my mom's check register from time to time. I was amazed at how little she made, but there was never a month she did not write a check to the church. When I would ask her why are you giving so much money away, she said it was because she knew God always took care of us, and she was going to always give back to Him. This tugged on my heart for years; but no matter how much I made, I never had anything left over to give to God.

And, yes I know, some of my offering goes to the boring things like water, electricity and insurance but so does part of my money at home. We use offering to pay the necessities, but we also use it to change lives, and that is the greatest thing a church can do.

My prayer is for everyone who reads this to understand and grasp the concept that if you haven't put God first and you are not giving, please try it. If you feel you could give more, please try it. My guess is you will be amazed at how your life changes and the peace that will come. I know mine was!

Inspiring Story: Do You Love Me?

ne day, I woke early in the morning to watch the sunrise. Ah! ... the beauty of God's creation is beyond description. As I watched, I praised God for His beautiful work. As I sat there, I felt the Lord's presence with me.

He asked me, "Do you love me?" I answered, "Of course, God! You are my Lord and Saviour!" Then He asked, "If you were physically handicapped, would you still love me?" I was perplexed. I looked down upon my arms, legs and the rest of my body and wondered how many things I wouldn't be able to do and thought about the things that I take for granted. I answered, "It would be tough Lord, but I would still love You."

Then the Lord said, "If you were blind, would you still love my creation?" How could I love something without being able to see it? Then I thought of all the blind people in the world and how many of them still loved God and His creation. So I answered, "It's hard to think of it, but I would still love you."

The Lord then asked me, "If you were deaf, would you still listen to my word?" How could I listen to anything being deaf? Then I understood. Listening to God's Word is not merely using our ears, but our hearts. I answered, "It would be tough, but I would still listen to Your word."

The Lord then asked, "If you were mute, would you still praise My Name?" How could I praise without a voice? Then it occurred to me, God wants us to sing from our very hearts and souls. It never matters what we sound like. And praising God is not always with a song, but when we are persecuted, we give God praise with our words of thanks. So I answered, "Though I could not physically sing, I would still praise Your Name."

And the Lord asked, "Do you really love Me?" With courage and a strong conviction, I answered boldly, "Yes Lord! I love You because You are the one and true God!" I thought I had answered well, but God asked, "Then why do you sin?" I answered, "Because I am only human. I am not perfect." "Then why in times of peace do you stray the furthest? Why only in times of trouble do you pray the earnest?" I had no answers ... only tears. The Lord continued. "Why only sing at fellowships and retreats? Why seek Me only in times of worship? Why ask things so selfishly? Why ask things so unfaithfully?" The tears continued to roll down my cheeks. "Why are you ashamed of Me? Why are you not spreading the good news? Why in times of persecution, you cry to others when I offer My shoulder to cry on? Why make excuses when I give you opportunities to serve in My Name?"

"You are blessed with life. I made you not to throw this gift away. I have blessed you with talents to serve Me, but you continue to turn away. I have revealed My Word to you, but you do not gain in knowledge. I have spoken to you but your ears were closed. I have shown My blessings to you, but your eyes were turned away. I have heard your prayers and I have answered them all. Do you truly love me? I could not answer. How could I? I was embarrassed beyond belief. I had no excuse. What could I say to this? When my heart had cried out and the tears had flowed, I said, "Please forgive me Lord. I am unworthy to be Your child." The Lord answered, "That is My Grace, My child." I asked, "Then why do you continue to forgive me? Why do You love me so?" The Lord answered, " Because you are My creation. You are my child. I will never abandon you. When you cry, I will have compassion and cry with you. When you shout with joy, I will laugh with you. When you are down, I will encourage you. When you fall, I will raise you up. When you are tired, I will carry you. I will be with you until the end of days, and I will love you forever." Never had I cried so hard before. How could I have been so cold? How could I have hurt God as I had done?



I asked God, "How much do You love me?" The Lord stretched out His arms, and I saw His nail-pierced hands. I bowed down at the feet of Christ, my Savior. And for the first time, I truly prayed.

So, I spoke to people getting food at a food bank and here are some things I learned from those in need:

- 1. Everyone donates Kraft Mac and Cheese in the box. They can rarely use it because it needs milk and butter which is hard to get from regular food banks.
- 2. Boxed milk is a treasure, as kids need it for cereal which they also get a lot of.

- 3. Everyone donates pasta sauce and spaghetti noodles.
- 4. They cannot eat all the awesome canned veggies and soup unless you put a can opener, (or a sharp paring knife can open those can tops), or buy pop tops.
- 5. Oil is a luxury but needed for Rice a-Roni which they also get a lot of.
- 6. Spices or salt and pepper would be a real Christmas gift.
- 7. Tea bags and coffee make them feel like you care.
- 8. Sugar and flour are treats.
- 9. They fawn over fresh produce donated by farmers and grocery stores.
- 10. Seeds are cool in Spring and Summer because growing can be easy for some.
- 11. They rarely get fresh meat.
- 12. Tuna and crackers make a good lunch.
- 13. Hamburger Helper goes nowhere without ground beef.
- 14. They get lots of peanut butter and jelly but usually not sandwich bread.
- 15. Butter or margarine is nice, too.
- 16. Eggs are a real commodity.
- 17. Cake mix and frosting make it possible to make a child's birthday cake.
- 18. Dishwashing detergent is very expensive and is always appreciated.
- 19. Feminine hygiene products are a luxury and women will cry over that.
- 20. Everyone loves Stove Top Stuffing.

In all the years I have donated food at the holidays, I bought what I thought they wanted, but have never asked. I am glad I did.

If you are helping a family this Christmas, maybe this can help you tailor it more. It does for me!
