The Hummingbird Story

A parable of the Quechuan people of South America, this hummingbird story encourages us to do what we can when we can.

How many times do we look at the world around us and become overwhelmed?

Do we ever look at what "big" things other people are doing and compare ourselves thinking our efforts are too small?

Be encouraged by this parable that our small efforts become big in the hands of God!

"Whatever you do in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father."

Colossians 3:17

"Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord and not for people, knowing that it is from the Lord that you will receive the reward of the inheritance. It is the Lord Christ whom you serve.

The widow giving her offering of two small coins in Luke 21:1-4, was affirmed by Jesus when He said she had given more than all the rest. Jesus went on to say in Luke 16:10, "He who is faithful in a very little thing is faithful also in much.

In God's hands, small can become big just like in John 6 when a boy's lunch of five loaves and two fish became enough to feed over 5,000 and also have leftovers!

This little hummingbird story can remind us to do what we can. Everything we do for the Lord Jesus matters. It counts!

Small counts in the hands of our BIG God!



know we have all prayed to God for many things. I have prayed so much for healing for family members, for friends, and even for people I hear about on TV that I don't even know. It's actually very rare that I pray for myself. (I tend to feel guilty about doing that).

The question I continue to ask is, "Why does God say, "No"? I know God is all powerful so God has the ability to say, "Yes." I know God is all knowing, so God has the knowledge of what people are experiencing; and I know God is love, so God cares. So, what's the problem?

I have said before and will continue to believe that we are here on earth to learn lessons. Apparently, some lessons are just more difficult to learn than others! In school I had no problem learning English grammar and punctuation, but maybe because I had little to no interest in it, I had trouble learning chemistry. (I'll admit that the only time I had even a taste of chemistry was in one chapter of college biology). We all have strengths and weaknesses. Maybe some of us are just slow learners, and some get the lesson immediately.

I also believe that God often doesn't really say, "No" but, "Wait." Sadly some lessons are learned only when we pass into the Other Side, but we still learn them. Some people seem to struggle or have a serious ailment for most or even all their lives. Others have a "bout" with something, and then it's over. Pastor Margaret Decker seemed to always use the phrase "in God's own time." I know we all want answers in our OWN time! I truly believe one of the lessons I still need to learn is patience.

Yes, sometimes God simply does say, "No." How many of you have said, "No" to one of your children, not because you are trying to be mean or to inflict a punishment or because you are not able to grant his/her wish, but because you know that granting that wish would be very bad for your child. We are nowhere near as wise as God, but we DO have some experience and knowledge that children simply don't have. What kind of parent would we be if we said, "Yes" to something that would endanger a life or cause irreparable harm?

One more thought on this theme is that when we pray, we usually mean "not thy will but MINE be done." (You know we do). We really need to turn that around and say "not my will but THINE be done." There is only one God, and none of US is! Therefore, when you pray, be prepared for an answer that is not what you hoped for. Try to remember that it might very well be the answer we (or someone we are praying for) need.
