Financially, we made a little more this year than last year. As many of you know, these pumpkins come from the Navajo Reservation in New Mexico, and this project is coordinated by a company in North Carolina. So, by supporting our pumpkin patch, your resources help communities across the country. Our congregation keeps 40% of the money from the sales. As of this writing, we will profit a little over \$1000! Thank you to all who worked, purchased, and supported this endeavor.
