What is a Fifth Sunday Sing? Well, let me give you a little background.

I receive a daily blog from Sean of the South. Sean is a good ole Southern boy. He writes about subjects that are near and dear to him. Back in August one of his daily writings was about Fifth Sunday Sings. Here is what I learned from him.

"Fifth Sunday Sings were started in the pioneer days. Back then, rural Americans couldn't make it to church every Sunday. So churches had "all-day sings," usually every fifth Sunday. After four Sundays, homesteaders traveled miles into town, camped out on the church grounds, brought food, and spent the Sunday hanging out. Singing. Eating. They'd shake each other's hands and say, "I haven't seen you in a month of Sundays." Some called them "camp meetings." Or "dinner on the grounds."

Food was always central to these quintessential small-church gatherings. Every dish is placed on a long table, alongside the others, and everyone eats until their feet swell and their ears ring. And the music tonight, it is not canned. It comes from the red-back hymnal. There is no praise team. No electric guitars. No fog machines. Only a congregation. And when it's time to sing, we all gather and sing until our chests are numb."

For a couple of years now, we have added extra music to our Fifth Sunday worship services. We thought it might be nice to have an extra fellowship time following our worship service, where we can feast and sing the good old hymns that are near and dear to us.

So on October 29 we are having a true potluck, no need to sign up for anything special, just bring a dish (main dish, casserole, side dish, salad, dessert) that you would like to share with others. We will feast and then have a sing along.

Jason and Stacie would like to know what some of your favorite hymns are that we don't do very often. We will plan on singing them in our after-lunch sing along.

On Tuesday, Sept. 12, 2023, James Smith, Jr., returned to God and Jesus. We are all grief-stricken!


