
Pledge cards may be placed in the offering plate any Sunday between now and December 15th. You may also mail them to the Church office.

o all the good you can, By all the means you can, In all the ways you can, In all the places you can, At all the times you can To all the people you can, As long as ever you can.

Do you know who said that? Yes, John, Wesley, the founder of Methodism! Did you know that he learned quickly how much money he needed to live on. Then, when he got raises, he continued to live on that same amount, and gave the rest to charity. I remember when I was a child that I would get so excited when Christmastime was drawing near because I couldn't wait to find

out what I was going to <u>get</u>; but even before I was a teenager, I became concerned about what I was going to <u>give</u> to a family member or friend. The older I got, the more I wanted to be sure people I cared about were receiving a gift from me.

When my children came along, I just wanted to know they were getting gifts either from Tom and me or from Santa. If I didn't receive anything, it didn't matter as long as they got gifts – because I love them. Church has always been a big part of my life so I have always wanted to give to whichever church I belonged to – and I really feel I belong, just like in a family. I care a lot about Trinity and all her employees. I truly want all of them to stay here for as long as they can (and want to). I also want our campus to look nice, partly for visitors and people who pass by and might be considering visiting us, and partly for our

members so we can be <u>proud</u> of how nice our buildings and grounds look. I also appreciate air conditioning, heat, light, and working bathrooms. I'm sure you keep your own homes and lawns looking as good as possible and functioning as well as possible.

Also, I was so proud to learn that we are one of only a small percentage of churches who pay 100% of their apportionments, which help to support 60, yes 60, missionaries. (Since our church can tithe, we as individuals should also tithe). I hope all you feel this way about church, its members, and its employees.

Luke tells us in Acts 20:34-35: You yourselves know that I have worked with these hands of mine to provide

everything that my companions and I have needed. I have shown you in all things that by working hard in this way we must help the weak, remembering the words that the Lord Jesus himself said, "There is more happiness in giving than in receiving."

Paul tells us in 2 Corinthians 9:6-8: Remember that the person who plants few seeds will have a <u>small</u> crop; the one who plants many seeds will have a <u>large</u> crop. Each one should give, then, as he has decided, not with regret or out of a sense of duty; for God loves the one who gives gladly. And God is able to give you <u>more</u> than you <u>need</u>, so that you will always have all you need for yourselves and more than enough for every good cause.

Luke tells us in his Gospel, chapter 6:38: Give to others, and God will give to you. Indeed, you will receive a full measure, a generous helping, poured into your hands – all that you can hold. The measure you use for others is the one that <u>God</u> will use for you.

Deuteronomy 8:17-18 says: So then, you must never think that you have made yourselves wealthy by your <u>own</u> power and strength. Remember that it the Lord your God who <u>gives</u> you the power to become rich.

When you have a duplicate of something (big or small) and just don't have a place to keep it any more, consider donating it to either the refugee center or CAM (Christian Assistance Ministries). Either place can receive clean, used clothing of any size. I have gone through my closet many times to pull out items I no longer wear, either because of size or style. Think about your neighbors in need.

CAM has two receiving places, but the one at University United Methodist Church, 5084 De Zavala, 78249, is nearer our church. Their hours of operation are 9:00 to 2:00 Monday through Thursday. In addition to clothing, CAM takes unexpired canned foods no larger than 25 ounces. They are located at the southern most end of the UMC parking lot off Vance Jackson. Just drop by during open hours.

The refugee center takes any household goods that are needed in the home: furniture in useable shape (beds, sofas, chairs, tables, lamps, book shelves, etc.), linens, blankets, clothing, diapers and baby things, kitchen utensils, dishes, pots and pans, dish racks, trays, cutting boards, coffee pots, pot holders, flatware and knives, storage containers, bathroom stuff - shower curtains, towels, bath mats, cleaning supplies - rugs, vacuum cleaners, iron and ironing boards, personal care items (toothbrushes, toothpaste, etc.), tools, brooms, and the list goes on. Trinity members Angie Khan and Julie Vincent are the contact people at our church for the refugee center. The center itself is located on Wurzbach near the intersection of Wurzbach and Fredericksburg toward I-10. Just talk to Angie or Julie to arrange your donation(s). Thank you.



One of my favorite hymns is from my days as a child in Sunday School. What a friend we have in Jesus was written in 1855 by Joseph Scriven. The first verse reads, "What a friend we have in Jesus, all our sins and griefs to bear, what a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer, O what peace we often forfeit, O what needless pain we bear, all because we do not carry everything to God in prayer." Kind of says it all. God has shown me such grace in my prayer life. He's done it for the prayer team. We continue to grow in our faith and our relationship with Him. It's that time of the year when we start to think about our relationship with God and ask Him for a deeper relationship and a more meaningful prayer life. It begins with His Word. There's a psalm for the morning and a psalm to read in the evening. There're also readings for Sunday's lectionary. These are the same scriptures read by Christians all over the world each Sunday. Bottom line: join me in asking God how we can grow in relationship with Him. We invite you to join the prayer team Tuesdays at 1:30 in the Null building. You can join us regularly or visit periodically.

May God richly bless us and increase our faith.
