While it is true that we come to church to renew our own spirits, we also are expected to witness to others. Witnessing can be good or bad. I know of a case in which a family was planning to join our church but changed their minds after a conversation with a member. Are you

witnessing for or against our church and Jesus and God? When you talk to visitors AND members, do you make them want to come back or find another church? We should ALWAYS build people up, not tear them down. Do you believe you are giving constructive criticism, when you are really just tearing someone down so you can build yourself up? Do you tell someone how to do something he/she already knows how to do, just so you can feel superior?

I am currently reading a book entitled People I Met At The Gates Of Heaven. It is written by Don Piper, the pastor who wrote 90 Minutes In Heaven. He tells in the first book about being struck by a truck and immediately dying. He was dead for 90 minutes and went to heaven for that time. The current book tells about the people who greeted him there. It is specifically about those people who were instrumental in his being able to get into heaven, those who witnessed to him about how to be a Christian, about who Jesus and God are, and who showed him love and acceptance. He truly believes that he would not have been allowed into heaven had he not had these people in his life to show him “the way.” (Of course, receiving “the Word” and accepting it are two different things).

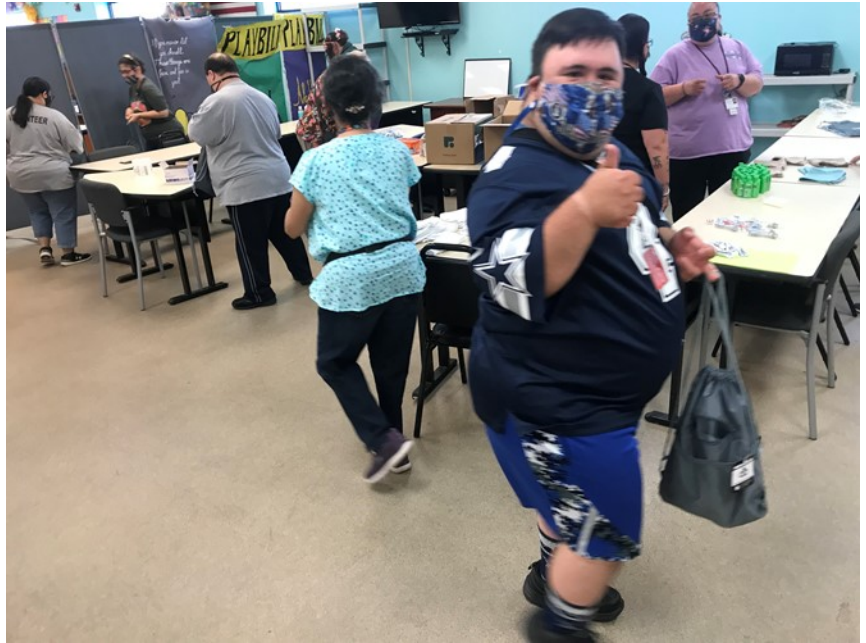
I have often thought about people in my life who guided me to a Christian life. I also wonder whether I have, even unknowingly, guided someone to Christ and God. We witness all the time, but do we witness FOR Jesus and God or AGAINST them? When you speak to people, specifically at church, do you hope you are convincing them to come back to Trinity, or do you think your words just might send them to another church? I hope and pray that you know that one of your promises when you join Trinity is to witness to others. You take a vow to uphold it by your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service, and your witness. Of course, all these other promises are important, too, but this one about witnessing FOR Trinity, God, and Jesus is on my heart right now. Please consider your intent when you say or do anything toward someone else. God knows what’s in your heart, and I suspect you do, too. Please ask yourself, “What is my goal here?”.

Would you be on anyone’s list as someone who led another to Christ? Would you be on the list of those who talked someone out of being a Christian, going to church, or believing in God? Doctors take a vow to “do no harm.” I believe all of us should take the same vow. Who will be waiting for you when (if) you get to heaven? Whom will you be waiting for because you witnessed to him/her? Remember that you are ALWAYS witnessing. The only question is for whom.

- Describe financial situation
- Complete the application personally

3. Have achieved grades in high school/college that suggest the capability of completing a proposed academic program
4. Provide three (3) Letters of Recommendation
5. Describe financial situation
6. Complete the application personally

Applicant should strive to provide sufficient and convincing information so the PEF Committee can best judge the applicant's qualifications for awarding the scholarship.

Please do not forget to request three letters of recommendation to be sent directly to TUMC, in care of the PEF Scholarship Committee.
