

Pastor's Reflection

LORD TEACH US TO PRAY Luke 11:1-13

Prayer is one of the great laws of natural religion. That human is a brute, is a monster that never prays, that never gives glory to their Maker, nor feels God's favor, nor owns his dependence upon God. One great design, therefore, of Christianity is to assist us in prayer, to enforce the duty upon us, to instruct us in it, and encourages us to expect its advantage.

Christ himself was praying in a certain place, probably where he used to pray. As **God**, he was prayed to; as **man**, he prayed; and, though he was a **Son**, yet he learned how to pray. The gospel of Luke reveals that Jesus was praying more than any other prophet before him and even after Him.

Jesus spent many hours praying, like when he was baptized as in Luke 3:21, when he withdrew into the wilderness, and prayed. He went out to a mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer. He was alone praying; and soon after, he went up into a mountain to pray, and as he prayed he was transfigured.

Thus, like a genuine son of David, he gave himself unto prayer. Christ prayed alone for long hours; sometimes he urged His disciples to watch and pray. His disciples were baffled on how to pray, applied themselves to Him for direction in prayer. When he was praying, they asked, Lord, teach us to pray. They wanted to pray correctly, they wanted their prayers, too, to be answered, so they turned to their master for some prayer lessons. We should note that the gifts and graces of others should excite us to do the same. Their zeal should provoke us to a holy imitation and emulation.

The disciples came to Jesus with their request, Lord, teach us to pray. Though Christ is ready to teach us, yet he requires that we ask Him for help.

They requested, "Lord, teach us to pray; give us a rule or model to pray, and put words into our mouths." Prayer is hard, and it is only Jesus Christ who can teach us, by his word and Spirit, how to pray. "Lord, teach me what it is to pray; Lord, excite and quicken me to the duty; Lord, direct me what to pray for; Lord, give me praying graces, that I may serve God acceptably in prayer; Lord, teach me to pray in proper words; give me a mouth and wisdom in prayer, that I may speak as I ought; teach me what I shall say." Jesus took time and care to teach his disciples how and what to pray for and Christ is also teaching us at Trinity everything about prayer, during our Sunday service and small groups. Prayer is not only communicating with God, it is also a weapon of our warfare against the evil one.

Lord Jesus, please!! Teach us how to pray.



"Ha, he thought. "What I need is a brick wall and what the Lord has sent me is a spider web. God does have a sense of humor."

As the enemy drew closer he watched from the darkness of his hideout and could see them searching one cave after another. As they came to his, he got ready to make his last stand. To his amazement, however, after glancing in the direction of his cave, they moved on. Suddenly, he realized that with the spider web over the entrance, his cave looked as if no one had entered for quite a while. "Lord, forgive me," prayed the young man. "I had forgotten that in you a spider's web is stronger than a brick wall."

We all face times of great trouble. When we do, it is so easy to forget the victories that God would work in our lives, sometimes in the most surprising ways. As the great leader, Nehemiah, reminded the people of Israel when they faced the task of rebuilding Jerusalem, "In God we will have success!" [Nehemiah 2:20].
