Dear Friends,

Trinity is a constantly evolving community of faith dedicated to making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. As such, Trinity has undergone many transformations over its 140-year history. These transformations have included changes in location, changes in leadership, in mission focus, and in worship style, just to name a few. Trinity has been affiliated with three different denominations, the Methodist Episcopal Church, the Methodist Church, and the United Methodist Church. There have been many up and downs. There was a time when membership fell to the point church leaders voted to close the church. Later the church grew to over a thousand members with three worship services every Sunday. Trinity was among the first churches in the former Southwest Texas Conference to welcome cross-cultural and cross-racial appointments. The church has been served by both male and female pastors, and all have been equally welcomed. What all of this says is resiliency is a big part of Trinity's DNA. The people of Trinity have always been ready to adapt to changing contexts and meet new challenges head on.

Currently, Trinity is experiencing another challenging moment in our history. Attendance has fallen dramatically over the last twenty years. Maintaining aging buildings and supporting staff and programming has become increasingly challenging as income has steadily decreased. Programming has suffered drastically. It is clearly time for a new vision and a new direction.

The good news is we are a resurrection people. We firmly believe that God not only can but will breathe new life over what is beginning to look like a valley of dry bones. Given our history of resiliency and looking back at what God has already done in and through this community, I am very excited to see and be a part of the new thing that God is currently doing. If there is one thing Sunday, June 16, 2019, should have taught all of us, it is to be prepared! I was ready to walk out the door to my house when I (and a few others) got a text from our pastor that he was ill and would not be in church that day. When I seemed a little panicky as I was leaving, Tom asked what was wrong. I told him, prompting him to ask, “Who is in charge now?” I told him that, technically, I was, since I am Lay Leader. I grabbed my bag of sermons and newsletter articles but found nothing that I was prepared to present to the congregation. When I got to church I looked for Elmer Beck, hoping he would have “a sermon in his back pocket” that he could deliver. He said he wasn’t prepared to deliver a sermon on such short notice, either.

When I was a child, I was a Girl Scout for just a couple of years. Their motto is “Be Prepared.” Then, I had 2 boys who joined Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts. Their motto is also “Be Prepared.” As far as packing for camping trips, learning First Aid, how to cook over a campfire, and how to put up a tent, we were pretty well prepared. There is even a book about worst-case scenarios, but nothing in there said anything about how to preach a sermon at a moment’s notice. Yes, I have read the book.

In Matthew there is a story about ladies who brought extra oil for their lamps and ladies who didn’t. I’m sure you know the story. Those who brought extra were present when the bridegroom arrived; those who did not had to leave to get more oil and, therefore, missed being there when he arrived.

In Genesis God warned Noah that a flood was coming. Even though his neighbors didn’t believe it, he went ahead and built his ark, collected animals and his family, and was saved when the floods came. Those who were not prepared all drowned.

Again in Genesis when Joseph interpreted a dream saying that there would be 7 years of plenty followed by 7 years of famine, Pharaoh ordered that the extra from the first 7 years be stored so that there would be enough for the people in the years of famine. Obviously, he was lucky that Joseph could interpret his dream so that he could be prepared.

I realize crystal balls are not something we routinely have in our homes, and very few are psychic, so there are many things we simply cannot know about ahead of time. Still, there are things we really can prepare for. We buy groceries so that we have food for the next meal. We put gasoline in our vehicles so that we won’t be left stranded on the road. We buy insurance so that IF something happens to our houses, our vehicles, or our bodies, we can repair (or replace) them.

The one thing that we can all do to be prepared is to make sure we “are right with God.” Do you pray for forgiveness when you have wronged someone? Do you apologize to the person you have wronged? As a Christian you hopefully have accepted Jesus Christ as your personal savior. If you have not, being prepared would be to do so. Do you really love God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength? Do you REALLY love your neighbor as yourself? As Meghan Trainor said, “We’re not promised tomorrow,” so we’d better make sure our souls are prepared today.


