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PASTOR'S REFLECTION FOR FEBRUARY

In the summer holidays of my last year of elementary school, I had gone to visit my aunty, about a hundred and twenty miles from home. As I browsed through the shelves in a nearby library, I think I was guided by the Holy Spirit, and began to read a book on the pastoral work of John Wesley and how he had transformed a city of sin to a city of holiness in North East Scotland. I wish I could remember the title of that book, so as to give it a second read. The story about the calling and dedication of Mr. Wesley and the Holiness and moral excellence of the people called "Methodist" captivated my attention and won over my soul to search and later wait for the Methodist missionaries to arrive.

Though it took a long time, they finally got there, and I quickly walked in and became a full-blown member. My spirit was longing for Christ through the Methodists like the Macedonians were longing for Christ through St. Paul; "During the night Paul had a vision of a man of Macedonia standing and begging him, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." Acts 16:9 My first impression about the people called Methodist was on the pages of a text book, and this was reconfirmed by the simplicity, humility, love and holiness of the Methodist missionaries who came and established that relationship with the local population. I am sure we can all recall the exciting moments of your first visit to our local church, or that moment when you gave your life to Jesus Christ. Those early moments are the foundations of our faith because we were and may be still attached to our first ushers, first Sunday school teacher, youth leader, choir director, and custodian and to our first pastor.

Sometimes I can still hear the bass voice of Mr. Smith singing "Jesus loves me! This I know," and the soprano of his wife, Elizabeth, when singing "Oh for a thousand tongues to sing." The return of the Smiths to North America was a near excellent education of the same feelings the disciples had when Jesus went back to heaven - the feeling about the end of my Christianity and my relationship with Christ.

Though there is nothing wrong in the way I sometimes celebrated the Smiths, but holding them as a panacea and pillar for my Christianity made me guilty of idolatry; and this, I was quick to realize by grace. As I continue to spend more time in prayer, in compassionate ministry and on God's word, God began to walk more closely to my heart, revealing more of God's self, inside of me; and the finished work of Jesus Christ at the cross became more glaring and more meaningful in my heart.

Most times, our first impression is the foundational reason for starting a relationship and for settling in that relationship. So my prayer is for us at Trinity to continue creating that space that ignited our first and magnetic true impression with Jesus, which is sealed with the spirit of love, simplicity, humility and holiness within the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ within our church community. We the people called Methodist are unique in our love for God and neighbor, in the manifestation of grace to all humanity; and our thirst for holiness is unquenchable. Can love lead in our church? And can we live to offer Christ to all?

It sure beats the alternative

Have you ever heard this reply when someone asks you how you are? I really hope this is NOT true! Of course, there are TWO alternatives - heaven or hell. What are you doing to ensure that you are going to heaven? Are you a “Sunday Christian” only? If I had to guess, I would guess that is not enough to get you into heaven. I have always heard that we can’t be perfect in actions, but we can be perfect in aim. In other words, we can earnestly and sincerely try all the time to do God’s will. Of course, we all “fall short” sometimes, but we must keep trying. Do you do your best to be God’s arms, legs, and mouth? OR are you a “pew potato”? Do you believe that just sitting in a church pew is enough?

What are you doing to ensure that you are going to hell? I hope, nothing. Still, I would encourage you to evaluate your behavior and ask yourself where you believe it will take you. Remember that your behavior may be just one way to get to hell. Your thoughts and opinions of others may work, too. Will God want you in heaven with Him/Her, or will Satan be happy to welcome you into hell?

Just today I heard Winona Judd say that when someone told her that Lisa Marie Presley is in a better place, she replied, “I don’t want her in a better place; I want her here with me.” She admitted that that is selfish, but it’s the way she feels. When I cried while sitting with Layne as he was dying, he said, “Harriet, I’m going to a better place.” I replied, “I know, but I’ll miss you.” For those of us who are left behind, maybe the phrase isn’t true; but for the individual who is leaving, I really do believe the phrase IS true.

Besides, there is no alternative of just staying here; I assume you all know that. Therefore, I would encourage you to live your current life with the goal of spending your next life where you want to be! And remember that we don’t really know when we’ll have to make THE move. Do your best to just be ready!

The Security Myth

Helen Keller said, “Security is mostly a superstition. It does not exist in nature. Nor do the children of men as a whole experience it. Avoiding danger is no safer in the long run than outright exposure. Life is either a daring adventure or nothing.” [John C. Maxwell, *The Confidence That Convinces*, Audio Tape].

Many people who withhold their wholehearted support from God’s work are victims of that “superstition of security” to which Helen Keller referred. They somehow failed to learn that no amount of money makes us totally secure from the painful experiences that life flings against our windshields without the slightest warning.

What happens when we try to create our own security blankets by avoiding the risk of being generous? Our selfishness costs more than money. It robs us of a spiritual relationship with God.

Self-giving does not bring us total security. Nothing does that. Being alive puts us at risk in a thousand ways. But generously giving our money to God’s purposes gives us a sense of meaning and purpose as we work with other people in God’s great causes. That is a far greater reward than anything we can obtain by striving for the myth of security.


Hello my brothers and sisters in Christ,
